

How to Speak at a Government Committee

Speaking at a government committee (deputation) is a great way to have your voice heard at City Hall. You can speak on issues like transit, housing, child care and more if they are on the agenda!

How to Sign Up to Speak at Committee

1. Go to **toronto.ca/council**
2. Click **“Committees”**



3. Find the Committee that you want to speak at. Remember: Committee agendas are released a week in advance of the meeting date!



4. Click on the meeting you wish to attend.

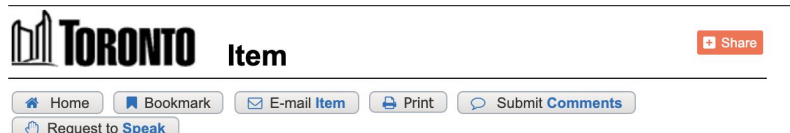

5. If there is an agenda available, click the relevant Agenda Item (e.g PH10.1).
6. On the top left corner, click **“Request to Speak”** to send an email to the Clerk to put you on the list of speakers for that meeting.



How to Structure Your Speech

Think of your deputation structured as a burger and reflect on the questions below to start writing your speech. You can use the worksheet to help you write!



Top Bun (Introduction): Who are you? What are you speaking about? What organization are you part of? What decision do you want the Committee to make?

Burger Patty and Toppings (Body): How does your lived experience fit in with the issue? How will the Committee's decision affect you? What are some statistics or facts you can use to strengthen your deputation and make it more compelling?

Bottom Bun (Conclusion): What decision do you want the Committee to make? What thoughts do you want to leave Committee members with? Remind the Committee why you're there!

Making A Plan to Speak at Committee

Here are some things to keep in mind as you plan for your Deputation:

- Do you know what time the committee meeting starts?
- How much time will it take to get there?
- Are you anticipating that a lot of people will be speaking on the same issue?
- Have you practised your speech to make sure it flows?
- Will your speech fit the amount of time you have?
- Have you considered what kind of questions Councillors might ask you?
